Patchogue

Predicting hazards

Patchogue received a \$10,000 grant from the New York State Emergency Management Office (SEMO) to craft a hazard mitigation plan for the village.

The grant will allow the village to identify potential disasters such as flooding, earthquakes and fires and how to alleviate the potential dangers from such hazards. Trustee Joe Dean said the plan itself isn't as important as what the village does with it.

"This is one of those studies I've been all too critical of," Dean said. "It's what we do with it that's important. It will give us the opportunity to apply for more SEMO grants."

Dean said the current raising of roads in the village is a result of a SEMO grant after the village identified flooding as one of the larger problems.

The village hired J.R. Holzmacher to assist a committee of local officials in writing the hazard mitigation plan. A presentation of the plan will be made at the Feb. 28 village meeting at 7:30 p.m.

Regular Meeting

March 14, 2005

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees met in the Municipal Building, 14 Baker Street, Patchogue, New York, on March 14, 2005.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Pontieri, with Deputy Mayor Perry, and Trustees Crean, Krieger, and McGiff and present. Trustee Seal arrived while the meeting was in progress. Trustee Dean was absent.

Also present were Village Attorney Snead, Village Treasurer Krawczyk, and Deputy Village Clerk Morabito. Village Clerk Lawler was absent.

Mayor Pontieri announced that a representative from JR Holzmacher would be providing a presentation on the All Hazards Mitigation Plan for the Village. Deputy Mayor Perry indicated that Trustee Dean was chairing this committee. He noted that meetings had been held with representatives from the Village Board, CDA, Fire Department, Ambulance Company, and Highway Department in order to review different facilities throughout the Village, create a priority order in case of an emergency situation, and create an evacuation plan. This was the first presentation on the plan to the Board and residents. Once the plan was completed, the Village would be eligible to receive various grants in the future. Community Development Director Biscardi noted that the creation of the plan was being funded by a \$10,000 grant from the State Emergency Management Office, and the Village's share of those funds was only \$1,300. The plan would encompass the entire Village. Deputy Mayor Perry thanked Ms. Biscardi for being the point person at Village Hall for this project.

Jim Brower of JR Holzmacher reviewed the progress made on the All Hazards Mitigation Plan to date. He noted that a committee had been formed for this purpose with its objective being to make the community eligible to receive grants that would assist with emergency management projects. Some of the steps that would be followed by the committee included evaluating hazards which were natural, technological, and human caused and assessing the impacts of those hazards. Once a preliminary plan was completed, public input would be sought. Mr. Brower stated that the plan was due to be finalized by September. Mayor Pontieri asked for clarification that the public could provide input through the CDA office which would then forward it to the committee. Mr. Brower stated that this was correct. Ms. Biscardi noted that the State had already granted the Village \$277,000 with which to raise a few roads. Since they had already realized there were serious flooding problem here, she was sure that they would be very willing to entertain future grant application. Mayor Pontieri asked if the plan would also include escape routes and evacuation centers. Mr. Brower stated that this was correct. Discussion ensued amongst the Board members and Mr. Brower. Mr. Brower noted that the integration of other planning efforts, such as waterfront revitalization was also important to this process.
